### **Category Descriptions:**

Nervous Novice - Someone who has never shown or has attended less then 5 schooling shows.

Youth – 18 & under

Amateur/Open - 19 & over

#### **Class Description/Definition:**

**Showmanship** – It can be shown in English or western attire. It requires a person on the ground leading their horse, wearing a halter (western) or bridle (English), through a series of maneuvers called a pattern. The pattern will likely include walking, trotting, setting up the horse, a turn on the haunches & possibly backing the horse. The horse itself is not judged on its confirmation. Rather, the exhibitor is judged on how well he or she exhibits the animal to its best advantage, with additional scoring for the grooming and presentation of both horse and handler.

Hunter Under Saddle & Western Pleasure - Classes are judged on manners, obedience, consistency, movement and pretty, in that order. This horse should look like the kind of horse you could trust to go riding in the worst windstorm and he would continue on his merry way without a hitch. The exhibitor will be asked to walk, trot/jog & canter/lope the horse in both directions and back.

**Discipline Rail & Command Class** – It is where you are asked to do things other than just go around the rail you may need to side pass, hand gallop, pivot, back up, roll back, lead change, extend trot, etc- basically they can ask you to do anything they want to and watch how you and your horse respond to the changes from the normal hunter under saddle class.

**English Equitation & Western Horsemanship** - Refers to a rider's position while mounted, and encompasses a rider's ability to ride correctly and with effective aids in. The rider, rather than the horse is evaluated. Judging criteria covers the rider's performance and control of the horse during a set pattern and on the rail, the use of riding aids, proper attire, correct form, and usually factor in rider poise and the cleanliness and polish of horse, rider and equipment.

**Trail / Handy Pony** - Is where horses and riders in western-style attire and horse tack navigate a series of obstacles. Contestants ride the course one at a time. Originally designed to resemble situations a horse and rider might actually encounter when on a trail in a natural habitat, modern trail classes now tend to focus more heavily on agility and manners, with courses bearing very little resemblance to real-world natural trails. A typical trail course requires horse and rider to open and pass through a small gate while mounted; walk across a fake bridge; cross over a set of rails or logs at a walk, trot or lope; back up, often with a turn while backing; sidepass, often over a rail or log; turn on the forehand or hindquarters within a confined area; and tolerate some type of "spooky" obstacle. The horse is asked to perform all three gaits in the process of completing the course.
